I am very excited our CONFIRM class went so well. It would have been much more fun with a larger class, but our one and only student learned enough and has decided to confirm the vows made for him at baptism. (We had a young adult who attended two of the sessions, and I hoped he would transfer his membership, but I have been unable to contact him to see if he is indeed interested.) We will welcome Sage Simpson into full membership on Sunday, June 30! It is a big deal, and I hope you will all come to celebrate with him this Sunday. We will have ice cream as a treat.

As I mentioned in the last edition of The Outlook, Wesley UMC has experienced a plague of vandalism during June. Trustees were at their wits end to discourage this behavior, but the perpetrator seemed to be relentless. The good news is that we know the main culprit's name, and we have been able to pray for him, which seemed to help. Please keep Steven in your prayers—pray for peace in his hands and his heart and for God to heal his anger, and please also pray for protection of your church. The bad news is that the vandalism has cost the church thousands of dollars. The trustees have determined the need for more fencing and some other security devices. You will soon receive a letter from the co-chairs of the Board of Trustees and me asking for a special financial contribution from everyone. (One of the Trustee co-chairs is away so is unable to sign the letter, but he contributed to its content, so please accept the letter without his signature.) Most of us wish that fencing was not required, but the cost, both financial and emotional for the staff and Trustees, makes it a necessity. Please look for the letter in the mail and prayerfully consider your ability to help.

We are again planning our fall line-up of studies. We had two very active, very successful Disciple I classes this year. Disciple is an in-depth study that requires commitment to Bible reading and consists of four separate studies. There are four sheets in the Narthex giving brief explanations of each of the studies. We are determining the degree of interest and whether we will have only in-person studies or if we can create a hybrid with a Zoom option.
