Thank you to everyone who attended the Charge Conference on November 4. It was a meaningful and productive evening, and I'm grateful for your presence. Our District Superintendent, Mary Maaga, had the pleasure of meeting many of you for the first time. We accomplished quite a bit together, including updates on Wesley's membership report. Special thanks go to Barbara Dethlefson, Ernestine Torres, Terry Gonzales, and Marlene Blair for their diligent work in reaching out to inactive members. Their efforts ensured that our membership reflects those who actively support our church with their prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

Other key accomplishments from the evening included the approval of the 2025 Pastoral Compensation report, the nominations report, and a celebration of the ministry we've carried out this past year.

One significant highlight was DS Mary's announcement of a new mission priority for the entire Central Valley. Her research shows that young people, ages 13 to 30, are facing poor health outcomes due to factors such as depression, isolation, loneliness, and addiction. DS Mary believes that the United Methodist Church is uniquely equipped to address these challenges, thanks to our emphasis on prevenient grace.

As you may recall, we, as Methodists, highlight three aspects of God's grace: prevenient, justifying, and sanctifying grace. Prevenient grace is the grace that goes before us, preparing us for faith. It is God's presence at work in every person, even before they are aware of it. This means that the young people experiencing these struggles are already being touched by God's grace. Our role is to connect with them, to offer community and support.

In the past, our "Growing Young" program made strides in welcoming people of all ages, especially young families. Unfortunately, like so many other initiatives, it was disrupted by the pandemic. Now is the time to refocus our efforts. This begins with prayer. I am asking each of you to dedicate time in prayer for this mission. Additionally, I encourage you to reach out to the young people you know and ask how we, as a church, can provide a sense of community for them. While we do have an online presence on Facebook, we know that it is no longer the platform of choice for younger generations. How can we effectively reach and support young people in the 21st century? Let's seek new ways—not to build up our numbers, but to build a community that offers safety, belonging, and faith.
