Marcia McFee of Worship Design Studio reminds us that the journey itself often holds just as much meaning as the destination. She writes:

"This Advent season, we will pay attention not just to the destination of Christmas, but also to the places where events occurred that led to a starry night on which a child was born who would change the world. And we will ponder our own milestones—the progress and the potholes 'on the way."

As we journey together, I will also draw from Rev. Rob Fuquay's book On the Way to Bethlehem to guide and enrich our exploration.

As you will read elsewhere in The Outlook, this season, we are collecting items for the Dream Center and Jamieson Center. The Dream Center in downtown Bakersfield provides vital support for teens in foster care and young adults transitioning out of the foster system. Through life skills training—such as writing resumes, opening bank accounts, and managing finances—the Center equips young people for independence. It also offers clothing, food, and necessities, including diapers for teen parents. Wesley has been a proud supporter of this impactful program for years.

Wesley has been approved for a grant from the Central Valley District Union to purchase updated equipment to enhance our worship broadcasts and sound system.
