#### A Note from the Pastor

#### Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved. Acts 2: 46-47

We begin a new worship series this Sunday, designed by The Church of the Resurrection in collaboration with Worship Design Studio. Marcia McFee describes the series, Do Unto Others, as follows:

"I want to always be answering the needs of the moment. And there is no more important time to be talking about 'doing unto others' in ways that foster kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love in the world than right now. With divisiveness and anxiety about that divisiveness—at an all-time high, how does our faith equip us to survive, and perhaps even thrive spiritually, in this moment? ... I realized we don't have all the answers to make us feel in control of our situations. But what we DO have are the teachings of Jesus—also someone who lived in turbulent times—to help us know what matters most. He invited us to focus on what a world would be like if we treated others in incredibly generous ways... because we know what it feels like to receive that kind of love."

I chose this period leading up to our national elections to focus on Do(ing) Unto Others. From my perspective, I believe our congregation is very open to differing points of view. However, I have spoken with people who find it difficult to talk to those they love about politics and religion—topics that deeply matter to us all. My hope is that this series will help each of us truly listen to perspectives that differ from our own. This has become increasingly challenging in a time when social media is shaped by our "likes" and unbiased reporting is hard to find.

I imagine everyone reading this is already aware that the pumpkins will be arriving soon for our fall celebration. This is our biggest fundraiser, especially important now that we've lost the rental income from the Head Start preschool, which moved out of our education building. One family has traditionally taken on the bulk of the work, but Carolyn has been quite ill and has even been hospitalized this month. Please stay tuned for updates from her on where she needs assistance. Of course, we need "all hands on deck" when the pumpkins arrive on October 13 after worship. Carolyn has suggested you bring a change of clothes to help set up the patch, but I'll go a step further and say I won't mind at all if you show up in jeans and a t-shirt for worship that day! God knows we do all things for God's glory, and I believe God will be pleased if we raise money to support ministry in Bakersfield.
